A New Engagement with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples



Dear Parents/Guardians, Friends, Staff, and Students of OLSH College

#### Social Justice Sunday

The Catholic Church in Australia has had a long tradition of commemorating Social Justice Sunday (the last Sunday of August) which will be celebrated this coming Sunday, 27 August. Prior to the day an annual Social Justice Statement is issued, and this has occurred every year since 1940.

This year's statement, Listen, Learn, Love: A New Engagement with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples, was launched in western Sydney on August 17 by Bishop Vincent Long, Bishop of Parramatta (NSW), chair of the Bishops Commission for Social Justice, Mission and Service. The 2023-2024 Social Justice Statement was chosen in May 2022, well before the Voice to Parliament referendum was mooted. The statements are issued with the hope of provoking thought and action throughout the year. In the 2023-2024 statement Bishop Long writes:

"We hear what God is saying to us about justice by being with our sisters and brothers on the peripheries of society. ... Listening is hard. Hearing about young people taking their lives, about so many people ending up in jail, of children still being taken away from their parents and grandparents and about the ongoing racism is tough. It must be so much more difficult for these people to tell us about their painful experiences. We are deeply grateful to those who shared their stories of pain with us. ... Our attitudes and actions towards First Nations Peoples need to be grounded in justice, love, and humility. We need to listen with deep respect and learn from them about what needs to be done to improve their situations. We need to walk with them, day by day, and work with them to bring about change for the better - for their people and for all of us."

#### Bathurst Island Pilgrimage

In an unplanned coincidence, last week I had the great privilege of re-visiting the Tiwi Island of Bathurst along with eight fellow Principal Directors from CaSPA (Catholic Secondary Principals Australia). It is indeed a special and unique place, closely connected to our founders, the Daughters of Our Lady of the Sacred Heart and the Missionaries of the Sacred Heart (MSC). Their mission work commenced there in 1910 until the early 1970s. The island has many a tale to tell from an unexpected involvement in World War II to a love and strong connection to all things AFL. As visitors to the island, we had opportunity to visit Xavier Catholic College including assisting in classes and getting a sense of how things are done at the island school. A visit would not be complete without trips to the historic and memorable buildings including the old convent (now a residential building), old and new Catholic Church, The Keeping Place (Art), Tiwi Island Designs, Frangipani Café, new cemetery, and a brief Island familarisation drive of Bathurst Island. The clear, crisp aqua-marine water, while inviting was definitely off bounds given its inhabitants are crocodiles!

The communities and people on the island are warm, hospitable, and proud, we were warmly welcomed. The opportunity to catch up with Sr Anne Gardiner (OLSH Sister and 2017 Senior Australian of the Year) and visit the Patakijiyali Museum established in the early 2000s by Sister Anne to preserve Tiwi history, language and culture is always a highlight. #### BATHURST ISLAND STAFF PILGRIMAGE AND IMMERSION





As a faith-filled community, Catholic values and beliefs underpin Our Lady of the Sacred Heart College's existence and are honoured and practised within the context of the OLSH charism, a Spirituality of the Heart stemming from the Chevalier family. Our Lady of the Sacred Heart College creates an environment where all students and staff reflect the College's values and mission, expressing the Catholic faith through:

- Respecting and celebrating our Catholic faith and tradition while honouring the living tradition of the Daughters of Our Lady of the Sacred Heart, founders of Our Lady of the Sacred Heart College;
- Becoming a dialogical school, assisting students and staff to experience and value the Catholic story in our culturally diverse communities;
- Providing students and staff with ongoing learning experiences at an intellectual and spiritual level in order to enhance the faith journey of the individual and the community;
- Developing a commitment to social justice programs that connect with others providing a variety of opportunities for students and staff to experience and practice the Gospel message.

An example of this commitment to the OLSH values and mission, includes two staff attending the annual pilgrimage to Bathrust Island NT every year. Earlier this month, Mr Mohammad Jafari and Ms Carol Adams were invited to attend this pilgrimage for an immersion experience, which values and keeps the charism of our founders, the Daughters of Our Lady of the Sacred Heart, alive.

Mr Jafari and Ms Adams had the great opportunity to visit the Tiwi Islands and spend time on Bathurst Island with Sr Anne Gardiner and staff from OLSH College in NSW (Kensington) and Victoria (Bentleigh). Sr Anne Gardiner has been on Bathurst Island since 1953 and has done an incredible job working with the Tiwi People.

It is very difficult to put into words what we witnessed and experienced on this trip. However, we did learn and experience the wonderful generosity, warmth, love, and hospitality of the Tiwi people and others working and living on the Island, this was evident from the first encounter when we landed on Bathurst Island.

On our visits to the primary and secondary schools, we learned that despite the challenges and adversity they face, students still attend school, and work hard to gain an education. It was incredible to see the strength and willingness of students to continue their education while staying true to their own Tiwi culture, spirituality, and customs. It was heartwarming to witness the strong bond and connection between the younger generation with their elders, who are helping educate the youth about their own culture, customs, and spirituality.

Sister Anne's valuable work continues to support the preservation of culture, community and story sharing and can be seen in the Patakijiyali Museum, now run by the Tiwi.

On our last day, we celebrated mass at the nursing home. Once again, Tiwi elders led the singing and prayers in both languages, holding our hands literally and our hearts metaphorically.

#### SATURDAY SPORT

Our Saturday sports winter season began at the beginning of Term 2 (in May) and ended with the final play-offs last Saturday, 19 August.

We were not blessed with the best of weather this year, with many of our outdoor trainings and games played in cold and wet conditions but it is great testament to our girls who continued to attend and get on with the job, showing great resilience and enthusiasm

For many years now, OLSH has increased its representation in sport with nine teams and 77 girls representing the school this winter season. Despite limited access to training facilities as a result of our current Stage 1 Masterplan development the girls have done extremely well. Every girl from each team is to be congratulated irrespective of whether their team finished as winners or if the season didn't go exactly the way they wanted. Winning is great but sometimes it is only through losing that we learn how to win and build character.

Across the board there is a tendency for girls to stop playing sport as they get older, whether it be due to increased study commitments, part time jobs or negative self image issues. We are impresed with the number of girls from younger year levels who played this season and we are hopeful that they will want to continue representing OLSH in the future as they progress into the senior year levels.

#### Netball

For the first time in many years, Netball was one sport that wasn't represented at a senior level – however we did field a Year 8, Year 9 and a Year 10 team.

The Year 8 netball team were quite new to the sport with many never having played before, but despite this, the team finished the season with a few wins. Both the Year 9 and 10 teams were extremely competitive in their respective competitions with both teams finishing mid-table notching up an impressive number of wins.

#### Soccer

Our middle soccer team had a wonderful season and should be exceptionally proud of themselves. The team finished in 3rd position on the ladder, and fought out a tough semi-final game, to make it into the finals. However they were beaten in the final 3-1 and ended the season as runners up - with a brand new sporting field we hope to go one better next year!

#### **Badminton**

Badminton is one of the most popular sports at OLSH College. We fielded 5 teams (3 Senior and 2 Middle). The Senior OLSH 3 and Middle OLSH 2 teams were comprised of our more inexperienced players and it was wonderful to watch their growth throughout the season. There were not too many wins, however the girls gave it their all and had fun. Last season our Middle OLSH 1 team won the premiership, this season they came close again with a strong season however they were beaten in the final.

Our Senior OLSH 1 Badminton and Senior OLSH 2 Badminton teams both had extremely strong seasons, losing very few games. The commitment they put in at training and the dedication to their sport was something to be admired. We congratulate both teams for winning their finals games and being Premiers for this season in their respective competitions. Well done girls!

#### SAMMY D FOUNDATION – PRESENTATION TO YEAR 8 – 10S







On Tuesday 8 August 2023, a representative from the Sammy D Foundation was invited to speak with the Year 8, 9 & 10 students about young people engaging with drugs, alcohol and vaping.

It was an informative presentation that touched on many facets of drugs and alcohol use, with the content addressing many of the issues that young teens face. The presentation included interactive activities such as 'beer goggles'to simulate how alcohol impairs your vision, balance and judgement, and how easy it is to pour more than one standard drink, as well as strategies to help measure and keep track of how much alcohol you've consumed. The dangers of engaging with underage alcohol and drug use were also discussed.

The presentation also included vital information on vapes and vaping. There was an emphasis on the dangers of vaping among young adolescents, and how colourful packaging and different flavours are used to disguise the nicotine and toxic chemicals that are inhaled when using vapes. The immediate and long-term health and wellbeing concerns associated with vaping were discussed. The presentation also informed students about the government's crackdown on illegal vapes sold to and purchased by young people. Students learned that the South Australian Government and SAPOL will be involved when a minor is caught engaging in vaping at school, bringing vape devices to school and sharing it with other students.

Our OLSHies found the presentation engaging, informative and powerful as they develop and navigate the world of being a young adolescent.
